Vocabulary

Essential Vocabulary:

Name - a word or set of words we call other people, animals, or places.

How - in what way you do smth, used to ask about the condition or quality of something.

Where - used to ask about place or position.

My - belonging to or associated with the speaker.

Your - belonging to or associated with any person.

Know - to have information about or to be aware of something.

Question - a sentence or phrase used to find out information.

Spelling - orthography.

Difficult - not easy, hard to understand.

Speak - to say words, to use the voice, or to have a conversation with someone.

Listen - to give attention to something you hear or someone speaking.

Read - to look at words or symbols and understand what they mean.

Write - to make marks representing letters, words, or numbers on a surface.

Below - to be in a lower position.

Again - one more time.

Repeat - to say, tell, or do something again.

Attention - the regarding of someone or something as interesting or important.

Between - in the period of time that separates two different times or events.

Easily - with no difficulty or effort.

Confused - unable to think clearly or to understand something.
